



Kitwell Sports Premium Plan



Since London 2012 Olympics, the government has provided funding to all primary schools to improve sporting opportunities, participation and the quality of physical education offered to children.

In 2016-17 this meant we were able to provide subsidised and free after school sports clubs (increasing participation) as well as involve specialist coaches in our PE lessons and provide additional training for our staff. We also increased the number of children who participated in competitive events.

The school's priorities are to increase participation in sport, raise performance and increase competition.

In 2017-2018 we will receive just over £8000 for the development of PE in school and we have set out plans to use this grant in the following ways:

- Free after school sports clubs.
- Specialised coaching/training opportunities to ensure staff are better equipped to deliver the curriculum.
- A designated sports coach who will run a lunchtime sports activity, lead and support staff in PE lessons and lead some of our after school sports clubs.
- Children will be given opportunities to take part in competitive sport. This will include a netball and football league (football tournaments) between a cluster of schools within the local area; badminton competition, tag rugby tournament, rounders' festival, athletics festival and table tennis events.
